Just 35 minutes from Grand Central Terminal, the Village offers seamless rail access to Manhattan, along with convenient regional connections via I-95 and U.S. Route 1. - **Manor Park** A private, resident-managed coastal park with sweeping water views, rocky shorelines, and winding walking paths perfect for quiet reflection or family gatherings.
- **Downtown Districts** West of Boston Post Road, two lively commercial hubs feature award-winning dining, boutique shopping, and year-round community events that draw visitors from across the region.

New York State Code Enforcement certification is required, along with a commitment to ongoing professional development.

This individual demonstrates a comprehensive knowledge of building codes, zoning and plumbing ordinances, and the New York State Multiple Residence Law. They are skilled at interpreting plans and specifications, identifying potential violations, and ensuring that safety and quality standards are met.

Strong communication skills are essential. The successful candidate will be able to explain complex code requirements clearly and effectively to contractors, architects, public officials, and residents. They will exercise sound judgment, tact, and professionalism-balancing firmness in enforcement with courtesy and respect.

The role also requires the ability to work independently and collaboratively. Supervising technical and clerical staff, maintaining accurate records, preparing reports, and applying modern technology are all part of the position. Physical fitness, reliability, and a valid New York State driver's license are required.

Ensures that construction practices meet not only local and state regulations but also relevant federal standards, safeguarding the integrity and quality of building projects.














Opportunities and Challenges

The Village of Larchmont is seeking a skilled and certified Building Inspector to lead code enforcement and building safety functions for the community. Reporting to the Village Administrator, this role is responsible for reviewing and approving plans, issuing permits, conducting inspections, and ensuring compliance with state and local codes. The Building Inspector will oversee both new construction and existing structures, safeguarding public safety while supporting high-quality development.

This position also plays a leadership role within the Building Department, supervising technical and clerical staff, modernizing processes, and maintaining accurate, transparent records. The Building Inspector serves as a resource to contractors, architects, property owners, and residents, explaining code requirements clearly and fairly while upholding the Village's standards of integrity, safety, and service.



Key Responsibilities

- Review and approve plans, drawings, and specifications for compliance with building, plumbing, zoning, and state codes.
- Conduct inspections at all phases of construction, renovation, and repair to confirm adherence to approved plans and safety standards.
- Issue building permits and certificates of occupancy; review amendments during construction as needed.
- Investigate complaints of unsafe or non-compliant conditions and take enforcement actions, including orders for correction or condemnation.
- Inspect existing buildings to ensure ongoing safety and compliance.
- Maintain complete records of inspections, violations, permits, and fee collections; prepare regular reports for Village leadership.
- Use modern technology to track inspections, manage scheduling, and produce documentation.
- Supervise staff, manage departmental operations, and ensure accountability and timeliness.



Qualifications

Education & Certification

- High school diploma or equivalent required.
- Certification as a Code Enforcement Official under NYCRR Part 1208 is required and must be maintained.

Experience

- Six (6) years of building construction or investigative code enforcement work, including at least one (1) year in a supervisory or contractor role; or
- A Bachelor's degree in Engineering, Architecture, or Construction-related field with two (2) years of design, construction, or supervisory experience.
- Equivalent combinations of education and experience may be considered (see substitution guidelines).

Special Requirements

- Valid New York State driver's license.
- Residency in New York State at the time of appointment (local residency requirements may apply).
- Commitment to ongoing training to maintain certification.

Knowledge, Skills & Attributes

- Strong knowledge of construction materials, building methods, plumbing, and inspection techniques.
- Thorough understanding of New York State and local building, zoning, and plumbing codes.
- Ability to read and interpret plans and specifications, prepare reports, and maintain accurate records.
- Clear, respectful communicator with contractors, architects, officials, and residents.
- Sound judgment, integrity, and professionalism-firm in enforcement, courteous in approach.
